### Principal's Report:

- The focus of institute day was artificial intelligence and helping our teachers become more exposed to AI. Also discussed was how it is transforming education.
- As a result of the AI presentation, I will be working on creating a set of guidelines for our district on the use of AI in the classroom and our philosophy. I have asked Mike Hall and Lisa Woods to help me work on these guidelines. My goal will be to have guidelines published for staff, students and parents before the start of the 2025-2026 school year.
- Working to schedule a second round of non-tenured teacher evaluations.
- Continuing to meet with staff for professional meetings every quarter.
- We reviewed the writing of behavior referrals during our institute day with a focus on being consistent and fact-based in the language used on the referrals.
- Ms. Elliott continues to work in health classes every Wednesday with a specific focus on student mental health.
